Resident Testimony

I want to paint you a picture of two women. The first woman is confident, self-assured, creative, healthy, goal-oriented, dream-driven, a safe and reliable friend, and a capable and loving mother. The second woman is full of fear, and in a place of hopelessness, she doesn't see her son anymore, she has no aspirations, and she is isolated and lonely most of the time. What do these two women have in common? Why do I speak of them both? They are both me.

Hi there, my name is Tiffany and a year ago I began a journey. A journey out of a lifestyle I never thought I could leave, into one of self-transcendence and into motherhood. I guess my journey began long before I decided to get clean. I always sought out new levels of awareness and understanding within myself, but always hit roadblocks due to addictions. When I finally completed my treatment after unexpectedly getting pregnant, I was full of trepidation. My future was unclear and I didn't have any idea what I was doing. Emma House welcomed me with open arms, literally hugging me when they picked me up from treatment. They've given me more than just a roof over my head. They've given me a family. Something I have never really felt much in my life.

They have supported and loved me, while also giving me the time and resources to learn to love myself again. Through the courses offered at Emma House, such as Boundaries, Safe People, Codependency, Nutrition, and Art Therapy, I have really been able to grow into the woman I always wanted to be, but never knew how to become.

Now I know that I am capable of raising a healthy, happy, and well-adjusted child. In a world I can't always control, I finally have the understanding and level of awareness within myself to raise a child that I can be proud of in that world.

Emma House has changed my world and made my son's world a better place.

Program Highlights

In 2022, Emma House provided programmed housing to 14 moms and 14 babies experiencing or at risk of homelessness. With a growing waitlist of 54 expecting mothers, there is a strong need in our community for services such as Emma House. Outside of programmed housing support, Emma House provided 74 moms and their children with life skills training, essential care items, referrals and Christmas gifts through our annual Christmas Campaign.

We also continued our Mentoring Mom's program as developed by University of Calgary researcher, Karen Benzies. This includes training volunteers and connecting them with one or more of our mom's to build a long-term connection of support and mentorship.
